## **<u>1966</u> CORUETTE** <u>Corvette specs by the year</u>



- The 1966 Corvette differed from the previous year because it had the following:
  - o A plated, cast-metal grille with an "egg crate" insert
  - o ribbed rocker panel mold-ings
  - o chrome-plated exhaust bezels
  - spoke-style wheel covers
  - a vinyl covered headliner
  - the elim-ination of roof vents
- The front fend-er sides again had three slanting vertical air louvers.
- Inside, the seats had an extra amount of pleats.
- Corvettes equipped with the new 427-cid V-8 came with a power-bulge hood.
  - Ten exterior colors were available

#### I.D. NUMBERS

- The serial number (Vehicle Identification Number -- VIN) was located on a stainless steel plate welded to the right side hinge pillar cross-brace under the glove box
- · Corvette engines have the last six digits of the VIN stamped on the block next to the engine number
- The body number plate was located on the engine side of the cowl.
- The Fisher Body Style Number 66-19467 identifies a Corvette Sting Ray convertible
- The Fisher Body Style Number 66-19437 identifies a Corvette Sting Ray coupe
- The body number is the production serial number of the body.
- The trim number indicates the interior trim color and material.

#### ENGINE & Transmission

- The standard motor was a 327ci V8 motor, overhead valve with a 4.00" bore and 3.25" stroke. Compression of 10.50:1 with 5 main bearings, hydraulic lifters, and a Holley four-barrel carb. Output was 300hp@5000rpm.
- Three optional motors were available: The basic specs were the same as the standard motor but one had 11.0:1 compression and produced 350hp. Two Big Block 427ci motor options were available, one with a Holley carb, 10.5:1 compression producing 390hp, one with a Holley carb, solid lifters, compression of 11:1, and produced 450hp, later to be re-rated down to 425hp for insurance reasons.
- A manual 3-speed close ratio was standard.
  - A manual 4-speed close ratio, a manual 4-speed wide ration. or an automatic 2-speed tranny was available

## <u>C5 Corvette Tech Tips – Part 1</u>

#### Dead Battery, reprogram RCDLR 07.06.03.001

Condition

Some customers may comment on a dead battery after the vehicle has been parked for a extended period of time. Typically, the battery will last approximately two weeks.

Because of a software anomaly within the remote control door lock receiver (RCDLR) causes an additional 30mA draw on the battery when passive locking is enabled and the vehicle is parked.

Correction: Reprogram the remote control door lock receiver.

On Corvette models, prior to reprogramming, remove the Radio/S-Band/VICS 15-amp fuse from the I/P electrical center (passenger side).

#### **C5** Throwing Codes

If you C-5 is throwing codes unplug this connector in the engine compartment and check for corrosion on the grounding strap bolted to the frame.

#### **C5** Computer Codes

Turn the key to the ON position, but don't start the engine. 2. Clear any present messages by pressing the RESET button. Hold the OPTIONS button down, and press the FUEL button 4 times. (This will get you into the CODES section of the DIG.)

4. The computer will automatically display all the codes your car has created. It will cycle through each code every 3 seconds. (NOTE: Any code that ends in H is a history code (something that has occurred in the past) but is fine now.)

5. Once the computer has finished going through all of it's codes, press RESET to enter Manual Configuration mode. It should start with a module and show "NO CODES" or "# CODES".

6. To optionally reset the codes once in manual mode, press and hold RESET until it displays "NO CODES".

7. Press OPTIONS to go to the next module, (ie, from PCM or Powertrain Control Module, to TCS)

8. Repeat the steps in this paragraph until you have reset the codes in all the computer modules.

NOTE !! Only reset the codes IF you want to - it is NOT necessary to do this.

9. When finished, simply take your key out of the ignition.

After retrieving the codes go to www.stengel.net/diccodes.htm to read what they refer to.

#### 2005 NavSystem/Radio Upgrade

General Motors has released a software update disk package consisting of two disks to update the software for 2005 Corvettes equipped with the factory Navigation option.

Technical Service Bulletin # 05-08-44-014A

You can order the disks from your dealer Part # 15836651 or have the dealer do the installation

The software update will do the following:

1) Modify the signal interface with the ARS module to correct poor reception conditions.

2) Add an on screen message to remind you that a destination is required before a route can be planned.

3) Add MP3 functionality.

#### **Column Lock Failure**

Condition: Some customers of 1997-2004 Chevrolet Corvettes equipped with a manual transmission (MM6/M12); 1997-2000 Chevrolet Export Corvettes equipped with an automatic transmission; and 2001-2004 Chevrolet European Export Corvettes equipped with an automatic transmission may have a condition where the column lock may fail to unlock the steering column when the vehicle is started.

This special policy covers the condition described above until February 29, 2008, regardless of ownership. The repairs will be made at no charge to the customer.

For vehicles covered by Vehicle Service Contracts, all eligible claims with repair orders on or after February 8, 2006, are covered by this special policy and must be submitted using the labor operation codes provided with this bulletin. Claims with repair orders prior to February 8. 2006, must be submitted to the Service Contract provider.

#### **2005 Heated Seats Inoperative**

Condition: Some customers may comment that the heated seat function is inoperative again, one week or less after repair for the same concern was complete. The technician may have previously replaced the seat heater element and heated seat control module assembly, and the new module may be inoperative.

Cause: Electrostatic discharge from the seat may cause the heated seat control module to become inoperative.

Correction: Replace the heated seat module with the redesigned heated seat control module assembly, P/N 10366538

#### C5-C6 Gas Cap Door Issue

If you find that your gas cap door on your C-5 or C-6 does not open when you push the button push inward on the door while pushing the button because sometimes the strap that holds the gas cap will cause excess outward pressure that the electric solenoid can not over come. When you put the cap back on make sure the cap strap is not sticking outward to cause this problem. There is a emergency pull cable located in the trunk area on the left hand side to use also if this does not work.

#### **Prevent Excess Wear**

To prevent excess wear on the plastic gears that open and close the headlights on your C-5 do it when you are stopped or at very low speed. The wind resistance against the lights when opening or closing at highway speed cause extra stress on the plastic gears and causes premature wear and the fix is expensive.

#### C5 Wheels Frozen to the Axel

If you find that you can not remove the wheels from your Corvette because they are frozen to the axle hub or rotor retighten the wheel nuts, then loosen each one 2 turns, lower the car to the ground, and SLOWLY drive the Corvette forward and backward while moving the steering wheel left to right. Remove any corrosion from the surfaces before reinstalling the wheels.

#### C5 problem with the A/C

If your C-5 has a problem with the A/C blowing hot air on the drivers side when you have cold air on the passengers side try this if you have the automatic A/C controls. The damper motors may just need "recalibrated". Do this with the engine running, try pulling and reinstalling fuses #18 and #27 in the passenger side floorboard fuse panel. The motors should reset when the power is reapplied if that is the problem.

#### **Unlock C-5 Radio**

Here is how to "unlock" the radio in your C-5 Corvette if you need to do this and will save you money at the dealers. 1. Press and hold presets 2 & 3 for about 10 seconds until the first 3 digits of the display code are displayed. 2. Write the numbers down, 3. Press the AM/FM button, write down the next 3 numbers. 4. Call 1-800-537-5140,when ask, enter 202107,press the "button" and enter the 6 digit code from the radio, you will get a unlock code, write it down. 5. Go back to the Corvette, press the "HR" button and set the first 2 numbers, then press the "MIN" button and set the last 2 numbers, press AM/FM button, "SEC" should be displayed, turn on the radio. To remove the preset code, repeat step 5. you should see --- on the radio face, the code is now out of the radio.

#### **C5** Synthetic Oil Specification

You must use synthetic oil labeled GM4718M in your C-5 and C-6 corvette for the GM warranty to be in effect. Not all synthetic oils meet this spec. "GM4718M" will be listed on the oil bottle label if it meets the spec.

Automatic Transmission Shift, Engine Drivability Concerns or Service Engine Soon (SES) Light On as a Result of the Installation of an Aftermarket Reusable, Excessively Oiled Air Filter

Do This	Don't Do This
First. Inspect the vehicle for a reusable	DO NOT repair under warranty if concerns result from the use of a reusable aftermarket oiled air filter

- Service Engine Soon (SKS) Light On
- Transmission shift concerns, slipping and damaged clutch(es) or band(s)

• Engine drivability concerns, poor acceleration from a stop, limited engine RPM range.

The oil that is used on these air filter elements may be transferred onto the Mass Air Flow (MAP) sensor causing contamination of the sensor. As a result, the Grams per Second (OPS) signal from the MAF may be low and any or all of the concerns listed above may occur. When servicing a vehicle with any of these concerns, be sure to check for the presence of an aftermarket reusable, excessively oiled air filter. The MAF, GPS reading should be compared to a like vehicle with a OEM air box and filter under the same driving conditions to verify the concern. Transmission or engine drivability concerns that are the result of the installation of an aftermarket reusable, excessively oiled air filter are not considered to be warrantable repair items.

#### **Seatbelt Retractor**

Owners of some 2004 Chevrolet Corvettes may state that the driver or passenger seatbelt will not extend from the seatbelt retractor.

If a resolution can't be found through normal diagnosis, replace the affected seatbelt and install a new bolt (p/n 15017724) and new washer (p/n 10257765) and discard the original bolt and washer. The larger diameter washer distributes the clamping load evenly on the lower seatbelt retractor.

#### **Fuel System Treatment**

GM recommends that you add at each oil change a bottle of GM part #12345104 GM fuel system treatment to your fuel tank. This will clean your fuel injection systems and will also help with the fuel gauge problem on the C-5 corvettes. It is also available at Wal-Mart under the name of "Techron Concentrate Fuel System Cleaner".

#### **Brake Line Messages**

The owners of some Corvette have experienced Service ABS, Service Active Handling Traction Control messages. Wheel speed sensor codes may be set. This condition may be caused by replacing the OEM rubber brake hoses with aftermarket stainless steel brake hoses.

It is believed that the metal in the brake lines conducts static electricity, causing confusion in the wheel speed sensors.

The brake hoses must be returned to original rubber ones before the case can be investigated. This is a customer-pay expense.

Wow, membership is back on the rise again. Six or seven new members over the last couple of months! Welcome to all the new members.


CCND members, don't forget about the new "For Sale" section on the website if you have anything you need to sell. Hey, it's free to all CCND members so take advantage of it.
